

Manson HS Equivalency Guide

Graduation Requirements

All Running Start students must complete all required courses and credits as well as meet all state of Washington and Manson School District requirements before being considered eligible for graduation and receive a high school diploma from Manson Secondary School.

College Credits

All college credits transfer to high school transcripts at the ratio of 5 to 1. Credits will be applied toward the subject area requirement for high school graduation, as indicated in the "Authorization to Register" or the "Quarterly Application" form.
