What is CAMP?

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) provides academic and financial support services to students from migrant/seasonal farmworker backgrounds during their first year of college.

The program strives to empower students so they have a strong foundation to build upon as they work toward a bachelor's degree. We provide the following services:

- Academic Advising and Support
- Career Planning
- Cultural Enrichment

- Financial Support
- Transfer Assistance
- Tutoring and Mentoring

Steps to Apply

- 1. Complete eligibility checklist to see if you qualify
- 2. Complete and submit WVC admissions application www.wvc.edu/apply select option 1
- 3. Complete and Submit CAMP Application with required forms and documentation

CAMP Eligibility Checklist:

- ☐ Must be US permanent resident or US Citizen
- ☐ Have a high school diploma or GED
- □ Enroll full-time at WVC (15 credits/quarter)
- ☐ Be a first-year incoming student with less than 20 credits, unless completed credits through running start or college in the high school
- ☐ A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- □ Participated in the Migrant Education Program MEP or HEP in K-12 and has a certificate of eligibility(COE #)
- OR either student or parent has worked in a
- Migrant/Seasonal farm for 75 days or more in the last 24 months
- **OR** participated in National Farmworkers Jobs Program
